OFFICER AND STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS


- Chairperson's Welcome
 - Hope you had a great summer, good to re-engage and see what we can do this school year.
 - Watched the recent board meeting was very administrative: looked at finacial audit and approved it. As well as looked at learning strategies for this upcoming year. Was very detailed so can go watch on youtube if you are interested.
- Principal/Vice-Principal's Report
- 1. **School Enrollment** Currently at 270 students, 14 divisions, 40 staff Student enrollment increased by 28 students from last year
 - a. Very smooth start up. Incredible to see the kids come back. The excitement of kids and staff. Hallways are just buzzing super fun.
 - b. Ended in June with 240 students, so had a big influx of registrations.
- Staffing Update: Classroom teachers: Ms. Rachel Nogard Mrs. Angela Woods Ms. Julie Allenby Ms. Ali Renwick Mrs. Sue Tompke (AL Teacher) Ms. Morgan Graham (indigenous helper) Mrs. Monica Padgham Mrs. Heather Morris Education assistants: Ms. Shaelyn Daase Ms. Tiana Guretzki Ms. Rafique Ms. Banham
- 3. Communicable Disease Plan (replaces COVID 19 plan)
 - Staff taught students the school Communicable Disease Plan guidelines during first week of school
 - PHO set guidelines from the CDC and then was received by the different groups to rework for the context of school.
 - There may be some difference from the public guidelines...for example public gathering numbers.
 - Staff went through this the first Tuesday afternoon, how does it fit with the context of the school, and what are the important pieces that they need to attend to

- Then took it to the classrooms and are teaching the kids. Big piece is hand hygiene, cough, and sneeze etiquette.
- O Don't have to have co-horts, so can go back to peer leaders, lunch monitors etc to give the grade 4/5's leadership roles around the school again.
- What happens if a student is displaying symptoms? Remove them away from people as much as we can. Maintain physical distancing. Regardless of age they will be asked to put a mask on if coughing. They will be on the buddy bench waiting for the parent to come pick up
- Positive Behaviour Support, School Code of Conduct/Dress Code taught by staff to each grade level.
 Teaching in this area continues throughout the year.

4. School Goals



- a. Vision: One heart, one mind, working together for a common purpose
- b. Numeracy, literacy, human and social, transitions
- c. East (yellow): Sun rises...beginning life. New growth. Life cycles repeat itself.
